## Recent Council Actions

The City Council authorized the issuance and sale of up to \$3.5 million in Revenue Notes for the refinancing of debt by Northwest Youth and Family Services

(NYFS). The City will not encounter any risk or obligation with the proposed financing. In addition, this type of financing does not impact the City's AAA bond rating.

The Council formally approved the Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement between the Rice Creek Watershed District, Ramsey County and the City of Shoreview for the participation in the purchase of the Lange Property. The Lange property is located on Lexington Avenue north of County Road E and south of Island Lake. This 4.5 acre parcel will become part of Ramsey County open space and will be used as parkland and for storm water storage. The City's total cost associated with this purchase is an estimated \$110,000.

The City Council also appointed Craig Francisco to the Bikeways and Trails Committee, which advises the City Council in matters concerning the development of bikeways, trails and alternative means of transportation. The Council also appointed Bob Minton to the Human Rights Commission, which provides guidance to the City Council on maintaining a community where all people are welcomed, valued and respected through public education and outreach programs.



**Run & Romp: Saturday, May 7**

The Arden Hills/Shoreview Rotary Club's annual Run & Romp, a "six-leg" event, (you and your dog), will be held on Saturday, May 7, at 10 a.m.

Participants can do a 4K or 7.5K run at 10 a.m. or a 4K or 2K walk at 11:30 a.m. beginning at the Shoreview Community Center Pavilion. The run/walk will follow the trails of Snail Lake Regional Park. T-shirts for participants will be provided as well as bandanas and dog treats for dogs.



Pre-registration for the event is \$20 per person and \$15 for participants under 12 years. Raceday registration fees will be increased by \$5. All proceeds go to the Ramsey County K-9 Foundation, Healthy Youth Foundation for Rotary youth scholarships and the Northern Star Boy Scout Council.

The City of Shoreview will host its annual Spring Cleanup Day on Saturday, May 7, from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. at the Ramsey County Public Works Facility (Highway 96 and Hamline Avenue). Residents are invited to bring the following items:

- General Refuse and Debris (fees will be applied)
- Household Hazardous Waste (free)
- Electronic Recycling (fees will be applied)
- Charitable Donations (free)

Residents must present an ID and pay with Cash and Checks only. Please note that this is not a drop-off for yard waste. Yard waste should be taken to a Ramsey County compost site.

### **City Water Restrictions May 15 - September 15**



Water Restrictions will be in effect from May 15 - September 15, annually. Residents with even numbered houses (last digit of house address) can water lawns on even number calendar days, odd numbered houses on odd number calendar days.

Since the south water tower is being repainted and is out of service until July, it is important that residents adhere to the odd/even watering restrictions this spring and early summer.

These restrictions do not apply to properties that use a private well for watering purposes, or for water uses including car washing, filling of children's swimming pools, children playing in a hose operated sprinkler or water toy, or hand-held watering of plants and shrubs.

Residents with newly sodded or seeded yards may obtain an exemption from the odd-even restriction for a period of two weeks. Residents requiring an exemption should contact the Shoreview Public Works Department at 651.490.4650.
