## Recent Council Actions

The City Council approved the establishment of additional on-street parking restrictions near the intersection of Owasso Heights Road and Owasso Heights Drive. The City has been monitoring the on-street parking situation in this neighborhood since the reconstruction of the area streets in 2007 and Staff recommended this change to address traffic concerns.



A public hearing was held as required by State law on the annual Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit. The report assesses the progress towards achieving the goals in the City's Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. There were no comments during the public hearing. The annual report will be submitted to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.

The Council accepted quotes for the 2011 Street Lighting Replacement Projects and awarded the bid to Q3 Contracting in the amount of \$59,450. This project includes the replacement of lights in the following areas Shirlee Lane off Nancy Street, Lake Bayview Court and Lake Summit Court off Kent Street. This Capital Improvement Plan currently has \$63,450 allocated for this project.

### **City Water Restrictions May 15 - September 15**



Water Restrictions will be in effect from May 15 - September 15, annually. Residents with even numbered houses (last digit of house address) can water lawns on even number calendar days, odd numbered houses on odd number calendar days.

Since the south water tower is being repainted and is out of service until July, it is critical that residents adhere to the odd/even watering restrictions this spring and early summer to allow sufficient water for every day use and emergency services.

These restrictions do not apply to properties that use a private well for watering purposes, or for water uses including car washing, filling of children's swimming pools, children playing in a hose operated sprinkler or water toy, or hand-held watering of plants and shrubs.

Residents with newly sodded or seeded yards may obtain an exemption from the odd-even restriction for a period of two weeks. Residents requiring an exemption should contact the Shoreview Public Works Department at 651.490.4650.
